Good Morning.

This is very professional work, all details are provided—wonderful

I like to bring up few points:

The analytical evaluations will be done by Toronto Water, no food plant has capabilities to test for these. Hopefully if someone is exceeding the limit, hopefully will be notified and given time to correct the situations. Food plants do not use any of these compounds, but still chemicals used in cleaning or maintenance may have to be checked. I am encouraging all my contacts to talk to the chemical suppliers to make sure none of these enter the sanitary effluent.

Some of the compounds like Chloroform are formed with the interaction of some other chemicals, at one of my account it was detected but they don't use Chloroform in the plant. On checking and investigating it was determined the chlorine based cleaners react to other chemicals to form this chloroform. The corrective actions were taken, the company is trying to eliminate chlorine based cleaners also, just like phosphorous based cleaners were eliminated. If Toronto Water ever finds out such interaction may produce any of these compounds, we will appreciate notification so corrective actions are taken. Industry would love to work to solve these problems but they need technical help as they don't have qualified personal who can look into this kind of work.
