The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Harry Joy on September 28, 2015.

Harry was a long-time member of the Photographic Historical Society of Canada and was well known for his photographs of the downtown area, especially Kensington Market in the 1960s. Over the six decades that Harry owned and operated Joy Studios, he worked with the Toronto Star as well as with many local politicians.

Harry's black and white photographs are featured in a photo essay prepared for Photographic Canadiana, issue 40-3, edited by Robert Lansdale and with text material provided by Harry's son-in-law, Wayne Gilbert.

This past January, at the age of 97, Harry attended the opening of his most recent exhibit at the St. Lawrence Market gallery along with the photos of photographers Doug Hemmy and Andy Brooks.
