SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

This report recommends the adoption of a by-law to enact an accessible parking zone on the south side of Engelhart Crescent further to a public request. There is currently unposted 3-hour parking at this location.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services recommends that Scarborough Community Council:

1. Des ignate an on-street accessible parking space on the south side of Engelhart Crescent, from a point 84 metres west of Harris Park Drive to a point 12 metres further west.

Financial Impact

The financial cost of installing these accessible parking zone signs is approximately \$500.00. Funding for the signs is available in the Transportation Services 2015 Operating Budget, within Cost Centre TP0397.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

Transportation Services staff investigated a request from a resident of Engelhart Crescent for an Accessible Parking Zone. Staff have determined that a small area on the south side of Engelhart Crescent, 12.0 metres in length, about 84 metres west of Harris Park Drive is justified. The Accessible Parking Zone regulations in the City of Toronto are recommended by Council on an as needed basis.

COMMENTS

The following characteristics describe this section of Engelhart Crescent:

- The land use on Engelhart Crescent is low-rise residential.
- This roadway is located south of Eglinton Avenue East, east of Victoria Park Avenue and west of Pharmacy Avenue.
- Sidewalks are located on both sides of the roadway.
- Engelhart Crescent is a two-lane local road with a speed limit of 50 kilometres per hour (not posted).
- Parking is prohibited at all times on the north side of the street and maximum 3-hour day-time parking (not posted) is permitted on the south side of the street.
- The Accessible Parking Zone will be located on the south side, 84 metres west of Harris Park Drive to a point 12 metres further west.

We anticipate the installation of the Accessible Parking Zone will have no negative impact on local residents and traffic operations on Engelhart Crescent.

Engelhart Crescent is classified as a local roadway in the City's approved Road Classification System. As such, the authority to implement the proposed regulation has been delegated to Scarborough Community Council.
