#### SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to nominate a Member of Council for appointment to the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) Board of Directors.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### The City Clerk recommends that:

1. Striking Committee consider Members' preferences and recommend to City Council the nomination of a Council Member for appointment to the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation Board of Directors for a three year term of office.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

This report has no financial impact.

#### **DECISION HISTORY**

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation is a provincial board that provides assessment services on behalf of Ontario Municipalities. The MPAC Board of Directors is composed of 15 members:

- 8 municipal representatives (either elected officials or officers/employees of the municipality)
- 5 taxpayer representatives
- 2 provincial representatives

Directors serve for a three year term of office for a maximum of two terms.

There are currently no Toronto representatives on the MPAC Board.

The Minister of Finance has asked the City of Toronto to provide two nominees, one elected official and one officer or employee for consideration. The Minister will select a candidate to fill one of the vacancies on the MPAC Board.

The City Clerk has canvassed Members for their interest in being nominated for appointment to the MPAC Board of Directors. Their responses have been summarized in Attachment 1. The City Manager will submit to City Council the recommended officer or employee nominee for Council's consideration.
