Dear Mayor Tory and Members of City Council:

On behalf of the Lytton Park Residents' Organization I am writing to request that City Council defer the Toronto Music Strategy item on this week's Council agenda so that there is an opportunity for genuine consultation with Toronto residents.

We are in support of the "The Toronto Music Strategy" which seeks to enrich our music and cultural experience however, in order for this "commercialization of our parks and public spaces" to be successful and fully accepted, it must also have the broader community support of both residents and businesses. Its implementation would likely require changes to noise by-law regulations, zoning, building and planning policy amongst other policy issues. More importantly, we are concerned with how our residents' enjoyment, privacy, and safety along with protection of our parks will be maintained.

We therefore urge you not to approve the Music Strategy before it is sent back for genuine and informed public consultation. Thank you.
