

## City of Toronto – Municipal Licensing Services Online Omnibus Final Report February 2015

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### Background & Objectives

- Ipsos Reid was commissioned by the City of Toronto to conduct research among a representative sample of Toronto residents.
- Specifically, the objectives of this research are to determine:
  - Presence and impact of rooming houses in Toronto;
  - Experience with and attitudes towards rooming houses; and



### **Research Methodology**

- Interviewing was conducted online via Ipsos Reid's iSay online panel.
- In total, n=1,011 interviewers were conducted with Toronto residents over the age of 18.
- Interviews were conducted between December 1<sup>st</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, 2014.
- The entire omnibus questionnaire took approximately 17 minutes.
- Interviewing quotas were administered and weighting was applied to the data to ensure that the results of the survey are representative of the City of Toronto population according to the 2011 Canadian Census.
- The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the poll is accurate to within +/- 3.5 percentage points.

Where possible we have shown significant differences using green and red highlighting throughout the report as such:

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## **Detailed Findings**



### **Rooming House in Neighbourhood**

- Just under half of Torontonians say that they do not have any rooming houses in their neighbourhood.
- Among the 18% who say that they do have a rooming house in their neighbourhood, there seem to be a variety of issues that are impacting neighbourhoods. Carrying relatively equal weight are issues surrounding: garbage, parking, visually unpleasant, noise, lowering property value, crime and safety.
- One-third of Torontonians who have a rooming house in their neighbourhood say that it has no impact.

### **Experience Living in Rooming House**

• Only 13% of Torontonians have ever lived in a rooming house in the City of Toronto and these individuals tend to be lower income.

• Nearly half of the rooming houses that people have lived in have had 5 or more people living in them while 20% have had 1-2 housemates.

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### **Opinions on Whether Rooming Houses Should be Available to Rent**

- Half of Torontonians believe that rooming houses *should* be available for people to rent. A large number of Torontonians (37%) are indifferent to whether rooming houses should be available to rent in Toronto.
- Overall 84% of residents either agree that rooming houses should be available for rent or are indifferent on the matter.
- Residents who are living downtown in old Toronto and East York are significantly more likely to agree that these houses should be available to rent where as Scarborough residents are most likely to disagree.
