Recommendations

City Council request the Executive Director, Human Resources, in consultation with the Director, Equity Diversity and Human Rights, and the Director, Employment Law Group, to report to the Executive Committee in the second quarter of 2017 on the feasibility of changing the City's policy to allow City Staff to take a religious day for those whose religion is not considered a statutory holiday.
