Recommendations

Councillor Joe Cressy, seconded by Councillor Gord Perks, recommends that:

1. City Council direct the City Clerk to advise the Registrar of the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario that the liquor licence application for Potbelly Sandwich Shop, 180 Bloor Street West, Unit 107, is not in the public interest having regard to the needs and wishes of the residents, and that the Registrar should issue a Proposal to Review or Refuse the liquor licence.
2. City Council request the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario or the Licence Appeal Tribunal to provide the City with an opportunity to participate in any proceedings with respect to the Premises.
3. City Council authorize the City Solicitor to attend all proceedings before the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario or the Licence Appeal Tribunal in this matter and direct the City Solicitor to take all necessary actions so as to give effect to this Motion, including adding and deleting conditions to any liquor licence issued for the Premises, in consultation with the Ward Councillor.

Summary

Halsted Hospitality Ltd. has submitted an application for a new liquor licence to the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario for a premises at 180 Bloor Street West, Unit 107, operating under the name Potbelly Sandwich Shop. The applicant is seeking a liquor licence for a capacity of 100 patrons indoors, and 18 outdoors. Due to the large capacity proposed for the Premises, and its close proximity to a residential area, impacts associated with the operation of the Premises may disturb neighbouring residents. The deadline for filing an objection to the licence was November 6, 2016.

This application for a liquor licence is not in the public interest unless certain conditions,

addressing the concerns of the community, are attached to the licence. Under no circumstance should a liquor sales licence be granted at the Premises without appropriate conditions attached.

This matter is deemed urgent as the deadline to object to the application was November 6, 2016.
