Comments:

I strongly urge members of the committee to support City staff's recommendation to prohibit the proposed Electronic Ground Sign. Electronic billboards flash a new advertisement every ten seconds causing visual disruption and light pollution which affects residents, park-goers and wildlife. The affected area would reach a kilometre away. The proposed location is especially egregious given its proximity to park land. Green space supports the physical and mental health of city residents, as well as providing habitiat for birds and other wildlife. The last thing people want to see when finding refuge in nature is yet another electronic billboard advertising. I don't think birds would be particularly impressed either. On top of this, the whole purpose of an electronic billboard is to attract the attention of drivers on nearby roads, decreasing traffic safety and increasing the risk of collisions.

I thank committee members for upholding staff's recommendation to prohibit the proposed sign and to protect the quality of this neighborhood.
