**Motions**

*Motion to Amend Item moved by Councillor Paul Ainslie (Final)*

That Scarborough Community Council request the Chair to write to the Ontario Minister of Health conveying the support of Members of the Scarborough Community Council for:

1. The Rouge Valley Health Community and Rouge Valley Health System should remain whole and not divided by the municipal boundaries.
2. The recommendations for infrastructure are high value. They have been previously

recommended to the Ministry of Health and needed by our community.

3. The Rouge Valley Health system should remain within the Central East LHIN.

4. Exploration of enhanced regional governance for the whole of the CELHIN that would be a more progressive and lower risk option than the contraction towards municipal health boundaries recommended by the Expert Panel.
