## Ontario Association of Architects – New Construction Energy Benchmarking Tool Development - \$31,629 over four months

The Committee recommended a grant of up to \$31,629 over four months to develop a tool that will automate the harvesting, reporting and aggregation of data available in energy models, to inform the design processes of new buildings and enable the tracking and analysis of performance trends across all new buildings.

The Committee's recommendation is subject to the following conditions:

- The OAA submit a revised evaluation plan for approval by TAF staff
- The OAA provide written confirmation that the completed tool will be made available to use, either for free or at a cost that does not preclude its use by the target markets

# Environmental Defence – Locking in Ontario's Clean Economy - \$300,000 over two years

The Committee recommended a grant of up to \$300,000 over two years to ensure effective implementation of the Climate Change Action Plan and promote its political durability.

The Committee's recommendation is subject to the following conditions:

- Environmental Defence submit, for approval by TAF staff:
  - a revised risk register reflecting the key risks to Environmental Defence in delivering the proposed project
  - a plan for increased mobilization of the constituents of existing Clean Economy Alliance members
  - a plan for building non-partisan support for the continuation of Ontario's climate plan and carbon pricing

### Canadian Urban Institute – Driving GHG Reduction through Data Visualization and Engagement - \$47,500 over six months

The Committee recommended against funding this proposal as it was unclear who the target audience was, why they would be motivated to use it, and what its ultimate energy reduction benefits would be.

### Faith & the Common Good - Data to Action: Driving Deeper GHG Reduction - \$258,000 over 30 months

The Committee recommended against funding this proposal. While the project was seen to be a unique and valuable collaboration among community partners, the proposed data platform was not seen to be addressing the main barriers to energy efficiency building retrofits in the faith and public sectors. The proposed revolving loan fund was also seen as insufficient to enable large-scale energy retrofits of buildings in the faith sector.

The Committee recommended an internal program allocation of up to \$35,000 over six months to coordinate an approach to mobilizing public and private capital for energy efficiency as part of the developing green bank concepts at the provincial and federal levels.
