CC32.8: COMMITTEE OF ADJUSTMENT NOTICE PROCEDURES

The Notice procedure for the variance application 28 Glen Echo Road is the one Councillor Robinson should be addressing. I'm not sure who received Notice for that application or why Members' Motions without Notice were moved to secure staff and resources to "settle" / "mediate" a decision that was refused by the Committee of Adjustment.

I became aware of Councillor Robinson's March 2017 Motion, MM27.7, seeking legal and planning staff assistance initially for a "consent and variance" application for 28 Glen Echo Road. I provided a submission to Council when I discovered this Motion. This Motion was subsequently withdrawn during Council's March 2017 meeting.

Then without any knowledge, in April 2017 another Member's Motion (MM28.49) without Notice was moved by Councillor Robinson. The actions of this Motion resulted in what was described as a "settlement" at the Board. I discovered this "settlement" on the day of the Board Hearing in July 2017. And I learned of Councillor Robinson's April 2017 Motion at the Hearing only after I asked whether the City Solicitor had the authority to attend the Hearing. When I inquired why I was not informed, the City Solicitor informed me to take the matter up with Councillor Robinson.

So Councillor Robinson: Why the urgent Motions without Notice for 28 Glen Echo Road and in particular the separate requests in March and then in April 2017? Who received Notice and who did you invite to negotiate this proposal? And how do you engage the OMB on such matters?
