Re: Appointment of Mike Creek as Interim City Councillor for Ward 28

We write to you to endorse Mike Creek as our recommended choice for a Ward 28 leader excellently suited to serve as Interim City Councillor for the remainder of Pam McConnell's term.

We are representative of people who have resided and worked in this community to make it livable and welcoming to everyone. We know Mike and his many contributions and we are convinced that Mike will give us the type of leadership that the community needs to ensure Pam's important works in progress keep on track through the end of this Council term. We are especially happy to support his candidacy because he understands issues and projects important to our communities and he has a style that will work very well with stakeholders across the ward.

Toronto Centre Rosedale is very fortunate to have such a person willing to serve in this interim appointment. We have so many key projects planned and under way in our Ward that need steady political support and advocacy. For this interim role, we need someone motivated to move these projects along because they are so important to the community and not for any longer term personal political agenda. Mike Creek is the right person for this job.
