**Subject: NY24.19 Pedestrian Safety Corridor - Avenue Road, between Lawrence Avenue West and Eglinton Avenue**

On behalf of the Lytton Park Residents' Organization I write in support of the August 10, 2017 Report from the Acting Director, Transportation Services, North York District recommending:

1. City Council adopt the traffic regulations outlined in Appendix "A" attached to the report entitled, "Pedestrian Safety Corridor - Avenue Road, between Lawrence Avenue West and Eglinton Avenue West", from the Acting Director, Transportation Services, North York District.

However, we thought this might be an opportunity to include integrated Bike Lanes. Why is it not a Pedestrian and Cycling Safety Corridor?

Nevertheless, the changes recommended will certainly provide a higher level of safety for pedestrians and cyclists alike.
