The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Glen Wesley Brown on January 27, 2017.

An accomplished community leader and activist, Glen Wesley Brown was born in Gravelbourg, Saskatchewan. Raised on the family farm, Glen moved to Regina before coming to Toronto in 1988. He was a key member of AIDS Action Now! and played important interim leadership roles with Toronto-based organizations, including Pride Toronto, the AIDS Committee of Toronto, the Ralph Thornton Community Centre, and the Canadian Lesbian and Gay Archives. His leadership was widely recognized and his contributions are deeply appreciated.

Glen helped numerous organizations transition and grow through difficult periods. His legacy also includes the mentorship of many young professionals and activists, as well as advocacy that resulted in the creation of the Ontario Trillium Drug Plan.
