
SUMMARY

This report recommends that City Council include 94 properties listed in Recommendations 1-4 of this report on the City of Toronto's Heritage Register. The properties are identified as contributing properties in the King-Spadina Heritage Conservation District (HCD) Plan (2017).

On December 15, 2017, the King-Spadina HCD Study Area By-law (1186-2016) enacted by City Council, which prohibits the demolition or removal of buildings or structures on the properties for a period of one year, will expire.

All of the properties identified in Recommendations 1- 4 meet Ontario Regulation 9/06, the provincial criteria prescribed for municipal designation, which the City also applies when assessing properties for its Heritage Register.

Properties on the Heritage Register will be conserved and maintained in accordance with the Official Plan Heritage Policies.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

On December 15, 2016, City Council enacted the King-Spadina Heritage Conservation District Study Area By-law 1186-2016, preventing for a period of one year the demolition or removal of buildings or structures on properties that have the potential to contribute to the cultural heritage value of the District. This by-law will expire on December 16, 2017.

The 94 properties identified as contributing properties in the King-Spadina Heritage Conservation District (HCD) Plan (2017) have no heritage protection until the Part V designation and HCD Plan comes into force. Including the contributing properties on the City's Heritage Register will ensure their interim protection until the City-adopted HCD comes into force.

COMMENTS

The 94 properties listed in Recommendations 1- 4 of this report are identified as contributing properties in the King-Spadina Heritage Conservation District (HCD) Plan, which was adopted by City Council at its meeting of October 2, 2017.

A map showing the contributing properties in the King-Spadina HCD is appended as Attachment 1. Separate attachments provide the Statements of Significance (Reasons for Listing) identifying the cultural heritage values and attributes, along with location maps and photographs for the properties on Adelaide Street West (Attachment 2), King Street West (Attachment 3), Richmond Street West (Attachment 4), and streets in King-Spadina with addresses beginning with the letters B to M (Attachment 5) and the letters P to W (Attachment 6). The photographs included in the attachments date to October 2017 except where indicated in the captions, and some attachments include archival images with the sources identified.

The properties identified in Recommendations 1- 4 are categorized according to three typologies: Residential, Commercial Row and Commercial Detached, which are identified in the King-Spadina HCD Plan. An overview of the historical development of the King-Spadina neighbourhood and the building typologies is provided in Attachment 7.

The assessment of the properties and the preparation of the Statements of Significance (Reasons for Inclusion) are in keeping with the City's new abbreviated approach for the inclusion of properties on the Heritage Register, which is designed to achieve an

informed, timely listing of groups of properties within specific areas or neighbourhoods in Toronto. While shortening the time it takes to research and evaluate properties for listing, this approach still applies provincial criteria as required in the Official Plan, but sets out a preliminary, not exhaustive, set of values. In this report, an understanding and articulation of contextual value is prioritized and, where information is readily available, additional values are identified.

The properties in Recommendations 1- 4 have been evaluated according to Ontario Regulation 9//06, the provincial criteria prescribed for Part IV designation under the Ontario Heritage Act, which the City also applies when considering properties for its Heritage Register. All of the properties meet the criteria under contextual value, and the majority of them also have design value (exceptions are the properties at 224 Adelaide Street West and 18 Camden Street, which have been altered). Detailed historical research was not undertaken at this time to determine potential additional values, including historical associations with individuals, communities and architects. The dates of construction cited in the Statements of Significance were taken from the Statements of Contribution in the HCD Plan (Attachment 5, Appendix D, pages 155-198).
