## Overview of the Consolidated Financial Statements



## **Individual Statements**

- Consolidated Statement of Financial Position
- Consolidated Statement of Operations and Accumulated Surplus
- Consolidated Statement of Net Debt
- Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows

- Summarizes the assets (financial and nonfinancial), liabilities, net debt and accumulated surplus at December 31
- Outlines revenues, expenses and surplus for the year and accumulated surplus as at December 31 This combines the operating, capital, reserve and reserve funds for the City and all of the consolidated entities
- Outlines the change in net debt as a result of annual operations, tangible capital asset transactions and changes in other nonfinancial assets
- Summarizes the City's cash position and changes during the year from City's sources and uses of cash

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#### Statement of Financial Position – Significant amounts

- Net Long Term Debt & Mortgages
  - Issued \$1,312M in debt during 2017
  - Repayments made \$424M in 2017
  - Sinking fund earnings \$58M
- Employee Benefit Liabilities
  - Went up by \$215M, 6% in total
  - Police up by 10.7% and TTC up by 7.6%
  - Post retirement LTD is the main cost



#### Statement of Financial Position – Significant amounts

- Net Debt
  - Increased by 9.4%
  - Due to investment in tangible capital assets, mainly in Social Housing and Transit
- Non-Financial Assets
  - Increased by 6.9%, with the most significant portion being:
    - ✓ Building and Building Improvements of \$1.4B;
    - ✓ Transit Infrastructure of \$231M;
    - ✓ Vehicle additions of \$295M; and
    - Machinery and Equipment purchases of \$491M
