TO Mayor and Members of City Council

The ABC Residents Association is a not-for-profit federally regulated community organization representing the interests of residents in the geographic area bounded by Bloor Street to the South, the CPR tracks to the North, Yonge Street to the East and Avenue Rd to the West.

The Board of ABC would like to encourage City Council to approve the recommendations of the Executive Committee to authorize up to \$13 million in additional 2018 funding to improve and accelerate the implementation of road safety measures identified in the City's Vision Zero Strategy, and to direct the General Manager, Transportation Services to focus the road safety measures on increased and accelerated traffic calming measures that we think need to include increased fines and enforcement of traffic rules as well as more red-light cameras.

City Council is approving development applications to intensify the City. It is past time that the reconsider their priorities to direct resources to improve pedestrian safety.
