PARA participated in the Broadview Avenue Planning Study and community members were vocal in their support for listing properties of heritage significance. We commend Heritage Preservation Services for their thorough research and the resulting report recommending inclusion on the Heritage Register of so many of the properties noted by community members.

Specifically, PARA supports inclusion of 778, 782-792, 812-814, 817, 822-826, 846-850, 849, 883, 895-97, 929-931, and 1216 to 1220 Broadview Avenue. Our committee has reviewed the report, the Statements of Significance, and Heritage Attributes noted for each. Our only confusion arises on the identification of the property depicted in the photo on page 20 of the report. The signage on the building itself and numbers on properties to the north indicate that the property may be 905 Broadview Avenue. Whether it is correctly 905 or 907, we support inclusion of this depicted property at the northeast corner of Broadview and Browning Avenues and appreciate the identified heritage attributes of the building as described.

All of these properties recommended for inclusion on the Heritage Register are significant to an understanding of our community's past and its development.
