Background

The public sometimes faced confusion when they sought assistance from the City


- City-wide support for the residential infill strategy









Improving Communication









Encouraging Good Construction Practices

- Additional zoning training for all Inspectors
 - Identify potential concerns early in construction process
- Improved verification of construction in compliance with approved plans
- Increased use of ticketing as an enforcement tool





Introductory Inspection

- Educates permit holders/owners/contractors
 of their responsibilities and identifies
 expectations and obligations from other
 program areas in the City
 - Explains enforcement actions should they not meet their divisional obligations.
 - Potentially mitigates the need for enforcement action from other divisions.
- Encourages project completion and Final Inspections request to clear all open permits.





Residential Infill Construction Information Notice

- Purpose
- Jurisdictional Scan
- Proposed Requirements
- Design



Purpose:

- Provide the public with clear, accessible and useful information that allows the public to:
 - Address and resolve issues early
 - Know where to go when escalation is required
 - Use the notice as a "Gateway" to City's real time information on enforcement and inspection status
- Fosters clarity about rules and supports good construction practices for infill construction
- Not intended to regulate or delay construction
 - By-law under the City of Toronto Act, not the Building Code Act

Proposed Information Notice Requirements



Requirements to Post

- Information Notice required to be posted on site where there is a permit to construct or demolish a "residential infill" building
- Sets out that applicants must submit project specific information to Toronto Building
- Electronic file containing Information Notice provided to applicants
- Applicants responsible for:
 - Printing
 - Installing
 - Maintaining
- Web based application under development for instantaneous processing



Enforcement

- Information Notice to be posted five business days prior to demolition commencing and within five business days of construction commencing
- Electronic submission of a photograph of notice on site
- Information Notice to be included in mandatory first inspection
- Authority being sought for ability to issue tickets
- Information Notice may be removed at occupancy




