About City Council Meetings

The Speaker

The presiding officer for Toronto City Council meetings is called the Speaker. She is assisted by a Deputy Speaker. They are elected from among Members of Council by Council itself.

The current Speaker is Councillor Frances Nunziata. The current Deputy Speaker is Councillor Glenn DeBaeremaeker.

Rules of Debate

The rules of debate are set out in Chapter 27 of the Toronto Municipal Code, Council Procedures. Generally, the debate on an item follows this order:

1. *Questions of City Officials or the Committee Chair* - Each Member is entitled to 5 minutes for questions and responses of Officials or the Committee Chair.
2. *Speaking on the Item* – When questioning is complete, each Member may speak on the agenda item. The Member may start his or her speech by making a motion to amend, defer, refer, or receive the item. Each Member is entitled to 5 minutes to speak. In some cases, Members may be entitled to a 2-minute extension.
3. *Questioning a Member Who Makes a Motion* – If a Member makes a motion, other Members may question the mover to clarify the motion. Questions and responses are limited to 3 minutes per questioner.
4. *Voting* – After all the speeches, the Speaker will call the vote on the item. If there are motions, the City Clerk will use parliamentary principles to order the motions. If a Member asks for a recorded vote, Members will press *Yes* or *No* buttons on their desks, the City Clerk will announce the outcome and the results will be displayed overhead.
