##### **The Chief Purchasing Officer recommends that:**

1. The Bid Award Panel rescind its October 16, 2019 decision to award Request for Proposal No. 9117-19-7172 to Mark G. Anderson Consultants, LLC (MGAC) for Scheduling Consulting Services for Liquid Train Upgrades at the Highland Creek Treatment Plant.
2. The Bid Award Panel grant authority to award Request for Proposal No. 9117-19-7172 for Scheduling Consulting Services for Liquid Train Upgrades at the Highland Creek Treatment Plant to MGAC Canada ULC in accordance with the contract details set out below:

## **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

The total contract award identified in this report is \$1,565,595 including all applicable taxes and charges. The cost to the City is \$1,409,866 net of HST recoveries.

Funding is available in the 2019 Approved Capital Budget and the 2020-2028 Approved Capital Plan for Toronto Water. The cash flow funding requirement for this project is shown in Table 1.
