Proposed Changes to User Fees

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to pass by-laws to amend the City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges, so as to adopt the changes to existing user fees and the new user fees that are proposed in the 2019 Staff Recommended Capital and Operating Budgets. The 2019 Staff Recommended Capital and Operating Budgets will be considered by City Council on March 7, 2019.

The Budget Committee will make its final recommendations on February 20, 2019, which will be forwarded for consideration by the Executive Committee at its special meeting on March 4, 2019 and to City Council at its special meeting on March 7, 2019.

While the 2019 Staff Recommended Capital and Operating Budgets sets out the recommended fees, the appropriate Committee may change these recommendations and Toronto City Council may adopt rates that differ from the recommendations, including fees that are higher or lower than the fees being recommended, and may adopt new fees not contemplated in the 2019 Staff Recommended Capital and Operating Budgets.
