On behalf of the University of Toronto, I am writing in support of Council efforts to address service gaps in the Downtown East Revitalization Area through a 5 year Action Plan.

The Downtown East Revitalization Area is facing a range of challenges affecting some of Toronto's most vulnerable residents and we support measures to enhance community safety, promote public health, and improve social and community services, and address housing shortages, among other challenges.
