## Attachment 1: Summary of the Stepping Up Framework's common vision, guiding principles and priority outcomes, 2016

The Province of Ontario's *Stepping Up: A Strategic Framework to Help Ontario's Youth Succeed* was released in 2016. It identifies 20 priority outcomes that are important for the positive development of youth ages 12 to 25 in Ontario. These outcomes are intended to inform policy design and program development across all service sectors (i.e. charities, not-for-profits, other levels of government, private sector) involved in supporting Ontario youth. Stepping Up's common vision, guiding principles and priority outcomes are summarized below.

**Common Vision:** Together, we will support all young people to become healthy, safe, hopeful, engaged, educated and contributing members of their communities and our province.
