Child and youth resiliency	16	\$843,584	69%	\$52,724
All streams	23	\$1,224,018	100%	\$53,218

- 6 approved LOIs, did not submit a full application
- All from child and youth resiliency stream

Reasons:

- competing priorities
- Smaller organizations with fewer resources
- Project champion left agency
- One agency's email and telephone number were no longer in service and their social media had not been updated since fall, 2018 – suspected that the agency has shut down

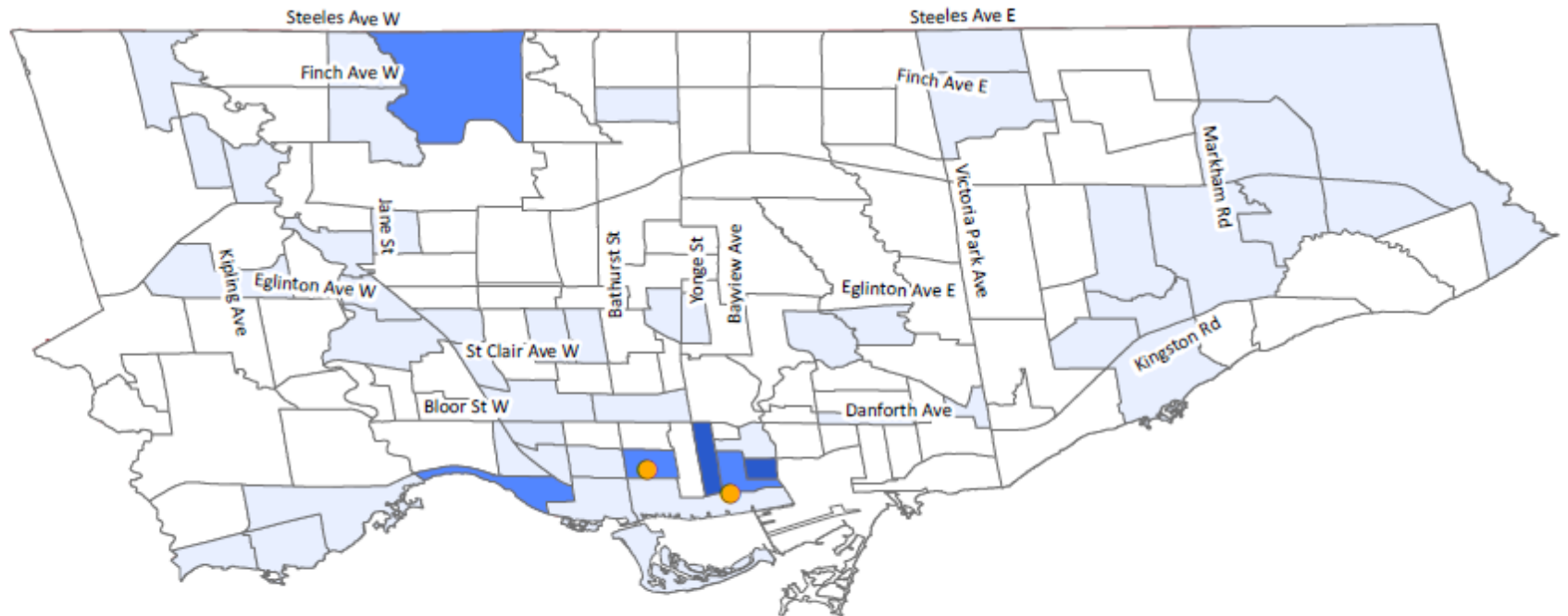

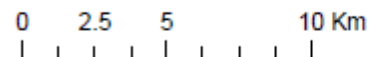

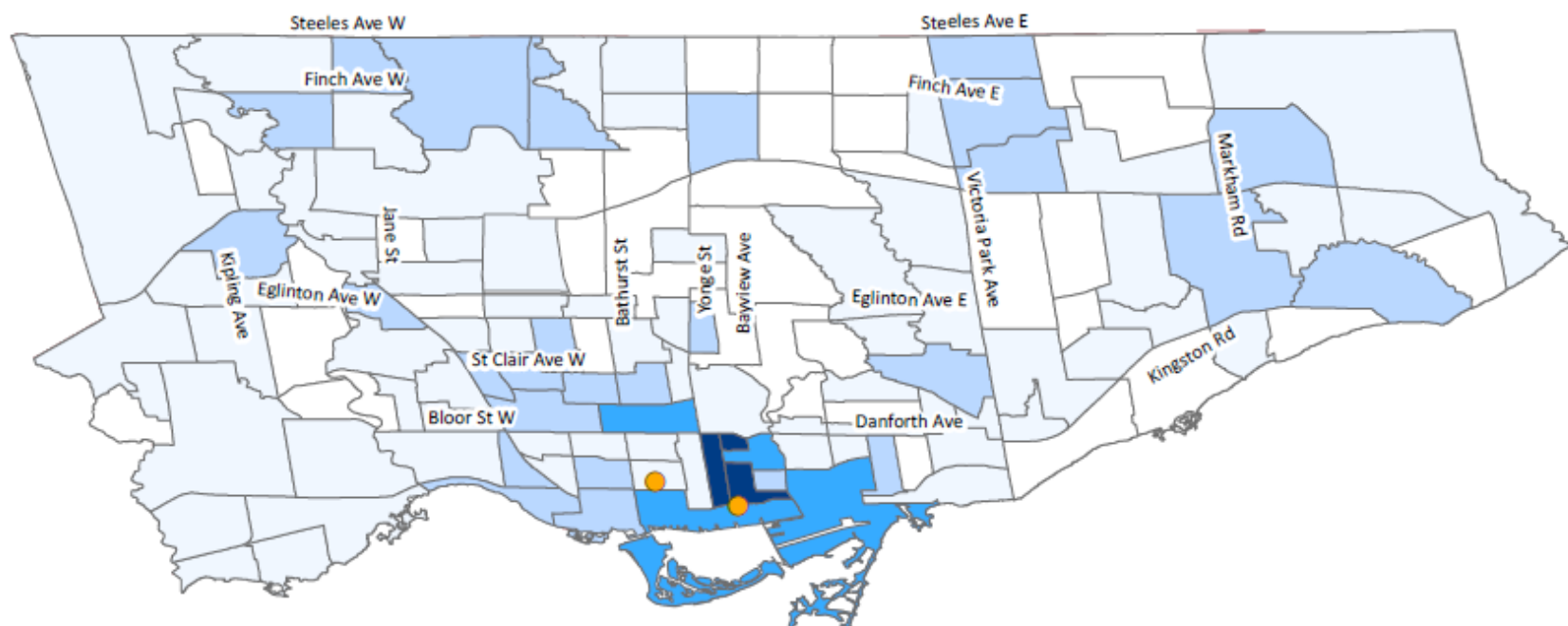


Number of 2017-2020 3 Year TUHF Projects Providing Service to Toronto Neighbourhoods: 2019 HIV Prevention Stream Applicants

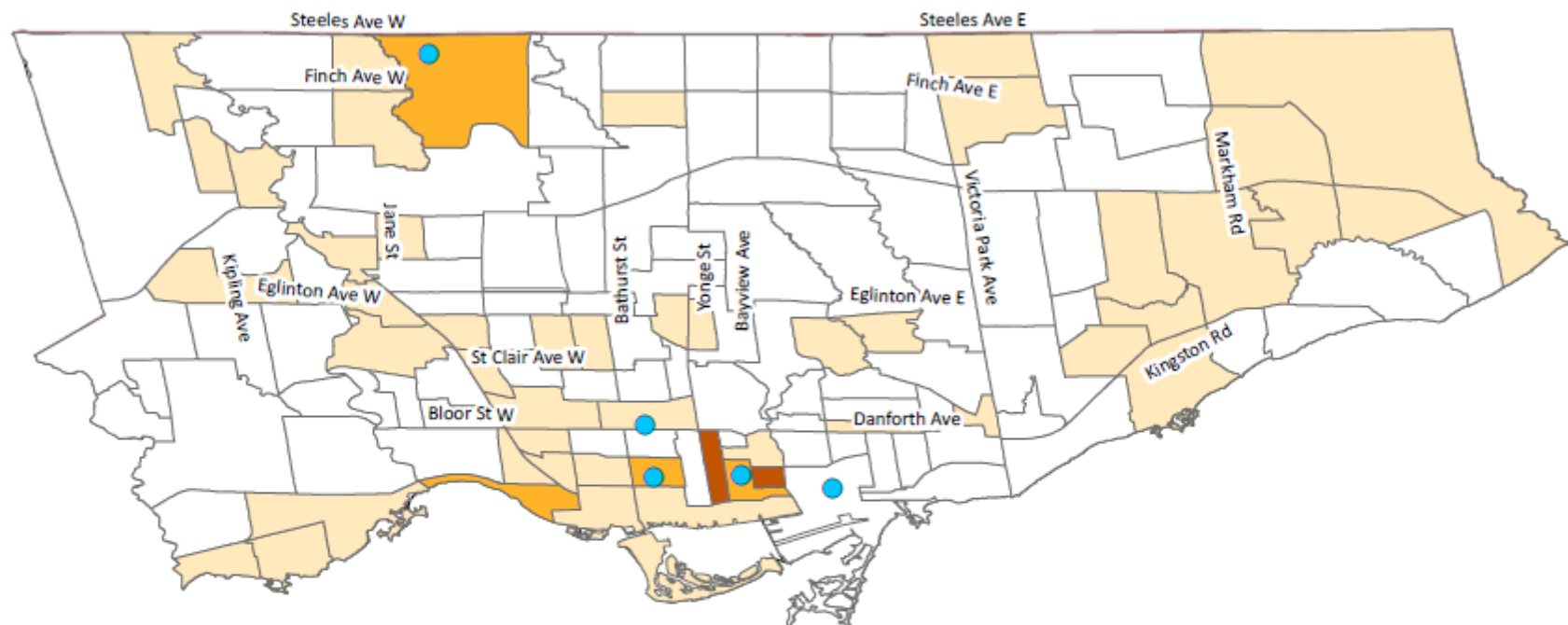

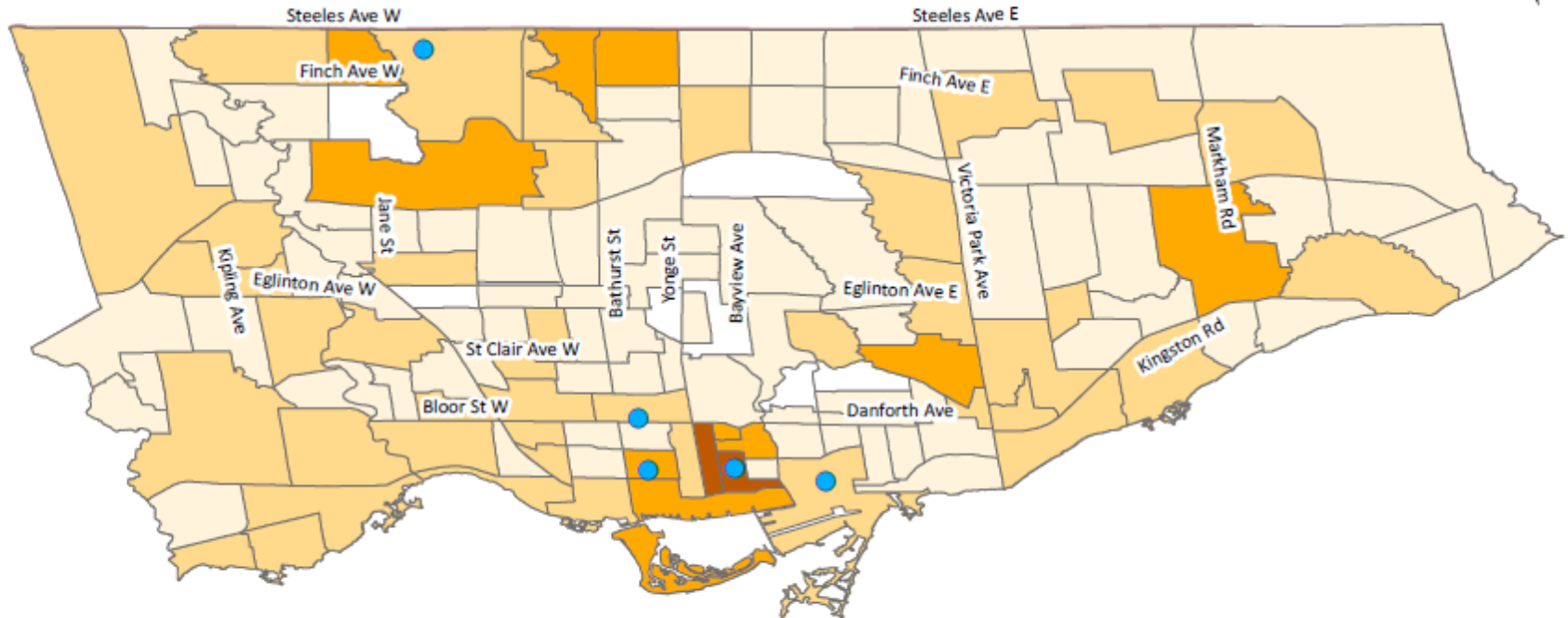


**Number of 2017-2020 3 Year TUHF

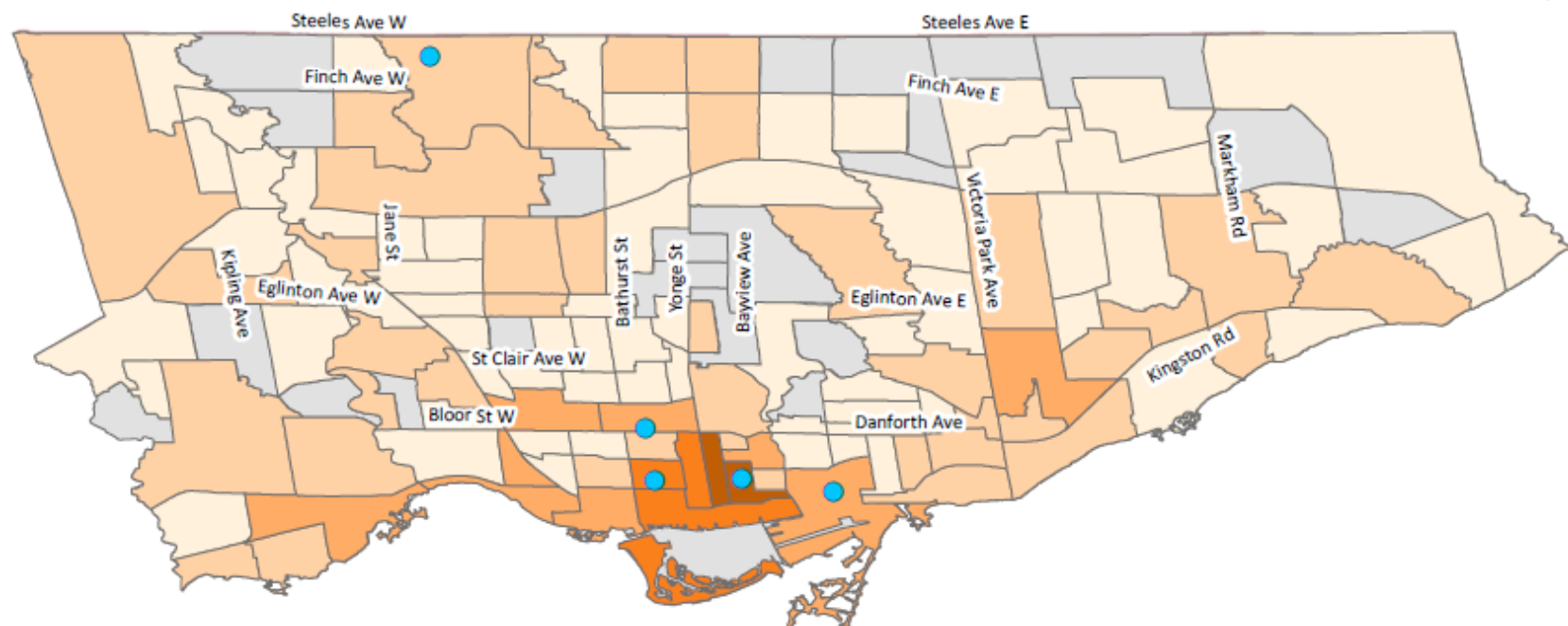

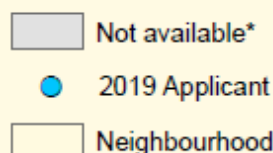
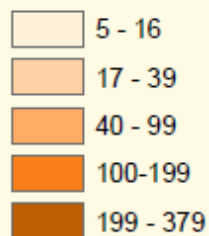
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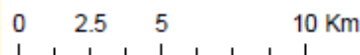

Suspected Overdose Calls (2018) by Toronto Neighbourhood: 2019 Toronto Urban Health Fund Harm Reduction Stream Applicants

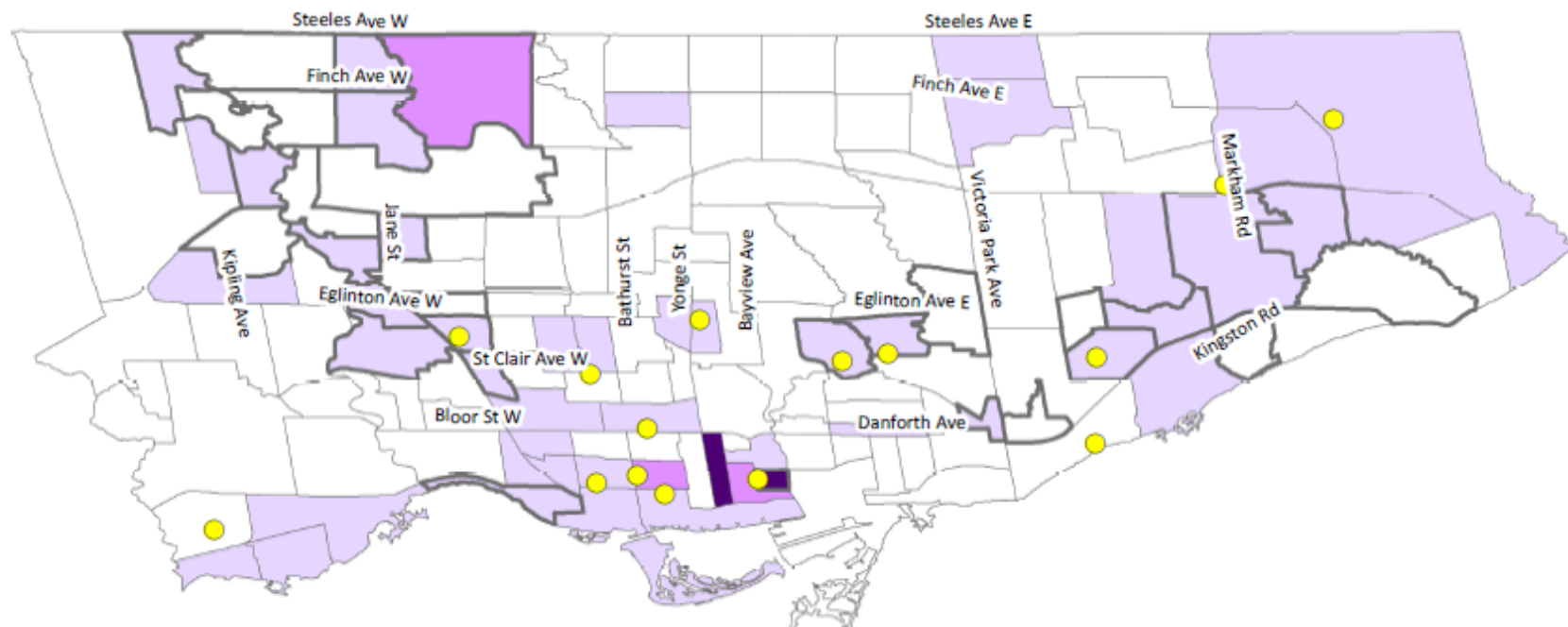

Number of 2017-2020 3 Year TUHF Projects Providing Service to Toronto Neighbourhoods: 2019 Resiliency Stream Applicants

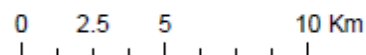
