Recommendations

Councillor Jim Karygiannis, seconded by Councillor Kristyn Wong-Tam, recommends that:

1. City Council request the Executive Director, People, Equity and Human Rights, in consultation with the City Solicitor, to report to the General Government and Licensing Committee in the second quarter of 2019 on the feasibility of allowing City Staff whose religious holidays do not fall on statutory holidays to take their religious holidays off as paid time off work without using sick days, vacation days or lieu time.

Summary
