PROPOSAL

The City of Toronto proposes to increase eligibility for office and industrial condominiums to receive Development Grants through the Imagination, Manufacturing, Innovation and Technology (IMIT) Program. The IMIT Program is implemented through the City-Wide Community Improvement Plan (By-law No. 516-2008, as amended), the South of Eastern Community Improvement Plan (By-law No. 517-2008, as amended), and the Waterfront Community Improvement Plan (By-law 518-2008, as amended). These CIP By-laws require, among other eligibility requirements, a minimum of 5,000 m² GFA and a construction value of \$5,000,000 per office/industrial condominium unit (https://www.toronto.ca/business-economy/business-operation-growth/business-incentives/imagination-manufacturing-innovation-and-technology-imit-program/).

It is proposed that the CIP By-laws be amended to remove the minimum size and construction values for office/industrial condominiums, and to add the requirement for the applicant to retain a third party facilitator to assist in the administration and tracking of Development Grants. This amendment would apply on a Citywide basis.

Community Improvement Plans Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Community Improvement Plans are adopted or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit comments to the City Clerk, attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Planning and Housing Committee, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act*, 2006, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.
