The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are saddened to learn of the passing of Warren Frederick Beasley, on April 15, 2019.

A graduate of Appleby College, Warren led a remarkable life as an entrepreneur, sportsman and family man with a strong sense of community service.

Along with his wife Noreen, Warren was owner and trainer of Beasley Racing Stable, which won the Queen's Plate in 1969. Warren was the proud founder and owner of Centreville Amusement Park on the Toronto Islands, which recently celebrated its 50th year of operation. He also operated Beasley Bingo at the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto and WaterFun Village in upstate New York.

Warren's many civic and community activities include service as a Councillor in King Township in the 1970s. His generous spirit led him to provide countless contributions of time and money to support worthwhile community initiatives.

Warren will be remembered for his sense of humour, his storytelling, his love of sport, his passion for horses and the decades of entertainment his businesses provided to the communities they served.
