Standing Prohibition - Tanis Crescent

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter for which the Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

This report recommends prohibiting standing at all times on both sides of Tanis Crescent at the curve in the road south of Kingston Road. Currently, parking is permitted for a maximum period of three hours on both sides of Tanis Crescent.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Acting Director, Traffic Management, Transportation Services, recommends that:

1. Scarborough Community Council prohibit standing at all times on the west and south side of Tanis Crescent, between a point 55 metres south of Kingston Road and a point 51 metres further south and east.
2. Scarborough Community Council prohibit standing at all times on the east and north side of Tanis Crescent, between a point 64 metres south of Kingston Road and a point 26 metres further south and east.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The financial cost of installing the recommended parking prohibition signs is approximately \$800.00. The funding for these signs has been requested in the Transportation Services Division's 2019 Operating Budget.

DECISION HISTORY

This report addresses a new initiative.

COMMENTS

As a result of a request from an area resident, Transportation Services staff reviewed the feasibility of prohibiting standing at all times on the both sides of Tanis Crescent in the area of the curve in the road. Currently, parking is permitted for a maximum period of three hours on both sides of Tanis Crescent.

Existing Conditions

The following characteristics describe Tanis Crescent:

- Tanis Crescent is located south of Kingston Road and west of Meadowvale Road.
- Tanis Crescent is a two-lane local road with a regulatory speed limit of 50 km/h.
- The curve in the road on Tanis Crescent is located south of Kingston Road.
- Currently, parking is permitted for a maximum of three hours on both sides of the road.
- Sidewalks are located on the east and north side of Tanis Crescent.
- The land use in this area consists of single family residential dwellings.

Based on a staff review, it was confirmed that vehicles parked on Tanis Crescent near the curve in the road. The parked vehicles restrict access for vehicles entering and exiting residential driveways, restrict the flow of traffic, and create a sight line obstruction for motorists and pedestrians.

Transportation Services staff have determined that it is feasible to prohibit standing at all times on both sides of Tanis Crescent in the area of the curve in the road.

The proposed No Standing Anytime regulation is anticipated to allow clear and unrestricted access to residential driveways, maintain the flow of traffic, enhance sight lines, and would be enforceable by Toronto Police Service.
