

Installation/Removal of On-Street Accessible Parking Spaces - December 2018 (Non-Delegated)

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval for the installation/removal of on-street accessible parking spaces for persons with disabilities.

As the Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) operates transit service on the subject streets, City Council approval of this report is required.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Acting Director, Traffic Management, Transportation Services, recommends that:

1. City Council authorize the installation/removal of on-street accessible parking spaces at the locations identified in Appendix A attached to the report dated December 14, 2018 from the Acting Director, Traffic Management, Transportation Services.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funds in the estimated amount of \$600.00 are available within the Transportation Services Division's 2019 Interim Operating Budget.

DECISION HISTORY

This report addresses an ongoing initiative.

The Transportation Services Division receives a number of requests for the installation/removal of on-street accessible parking spaces for persons with disabilities. Some of these requests come directly from members of the public and others are received through the local Councillors' offices.

The installation of designated on-street accessible parking spaces is a convenience provided for people with disabilities and/or those who transport them, making it easier for them to find available parking as near as possible to their places of residence or intended destinations and reducing the distances that the disabled people must walk. Delays in installing these on-street accessible spaces may create hardships for disabled applicants.

Timely removal of designated on-street accessible parking spaces when these spaces are no longer required is necessary in order to maximize available on-street parking for other residents/motorists.

COMMENTS

Transportation Services staff have investigated the feasibility of installing/removing on-street accessible parking spaces at the locations identified in Appendix A included in this report. The subject streets are served by TTC transit routes.

For locations where on-street accessible parking spaces are being established, all applicants are holders of valid Accessible Parking Permits issued by the Ministry of Transportation and each designated space will not result in the loss of more than one on-street parking space for general use. Locations where on-street accessible parking spaces are to be removed are the result of applicants moving, holding expired permits or no longer requiring these on-street parking spaces. In certain instances, existing accessible parking spaces may be relocated for technical or operational reasons.

Ward	Location
9	Dovercourt Road, east side, between a point 179 metres south of Davenport Road and a point 5.5 metres further south

On-street accessible parking space to be installed:

Ward	Location
19	Wineva Avenue, east side, between a point 88 metres south of Williamson Road and a point 5.5 metres further south
