## Subject: Sugar Shack TO at Sugar Beach on March 9 & 10, 2019

## Dear Councillors,

We are writing in regards to the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual *Sugar Shack TO*. Sugar Shack TO is set to return again for its fourth year to celebrate the end of winter with a sweet flavour of Ontario's finest maple products with Toronto's very own sugar shack. Bringing together every one of all ages, this public event will bring together over 10,000 people. This year, the Festival will be held at the waterfront portion of Sherbourne Common located at Lower Sherbourne Street & Queens Quay East.

Located at the foot of Lower Sherbourne Street adjacent to the Chorus building, the 14,700 square metre (3.63 acre) park, is one of the earliest parks in Canada to incorporate a neighborhood-wide storm water treatment facility into its design. Sherbourne Common consists of a 240 meter long water channel featuring three art sculptures that rise nine meters, called "Light Showers." It is easily accessible via the TTC while parking is also available at several lots within walking distance. The area runs parallel to Lake Ontario, providing beautiful scenery as well as a breath of fresh air for all visitors to the area. This year, Sugar Shack TO is again expected to provide countless enjoyable and memorable experiences for its guests.

In order to ensure that our Festival continues to run smoothly and efficiently for all parties involved, we continue to improve our efforts to provide a safe environment. Our management team is supported by experienced and well-trained event staff. Our team is well versed in contingency plans, which we work on diligently with all of our Festival partners, Sherbourne Commons, our security companies and Sugar Shack TO representatives.

We at Drink Inc. Events feel that the *Sugar Shack TO* is significant to the city of Toronto. We look forward to a Festival intended for the people of Toronto and visiting winter tourists giving a taste of all of Ontario in the heart of the city. The Festival is expected to attract approximately 4,000 people, supporting Toronto's community.
