## RE: PH16.4 Addressing the Committee of Adjustment COVID-19 Related Application Backlog

Dear Mayor John Tory and Members of City Council,

This is to advise that FoNTRA supports the Planning and Housing Committee (PHC) recommendation that:

 City Council resolve that, notwithstanding Section 4-2 of the Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 4, Adjustment, Committee of, and By-law 1134-2019, all Districts and Panels will be comprised of a majority of previously appointed members of for those hearings, with cross-appointed members representing a minority of those Districts and Panels, until the end of November 14, 2022.

The point (which was reiterated by several Councillors at PHC) is that applications need to be heard by members from the applicable district. We understand the intent would be to cross-appoint members (particularly of the Etobicoke and Scarborough panels) to the TEY Panel in order to expedite the backlog in TEY.

Unfortunately the North York Committee of Adjustment hearings schedule from October 7 to November 19 includes cases switched from other districts. The October 7 agenda, the one with a published agenda, has four cases from TEY. We wonder how residents of the Beach and Parkdale/High Park will appreciate having their cases dealt with by North York CofA (assuming they are made aware of this).

What has happened here in North York on October 7 is a **switching of cases** between districts, not **cross-appointment** of members. We do not believe that this practice meets the intent of the PHC resolution, and we request that it cease.
