

City of Toronto Act, 2006 Public Notice
Innovative Partnership for Digital Government Platform

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to adopt amendments to Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges.

It is proposed that the amendments be adopted at the City Council meeting to be held on July 28 and 29, 2020, or at a subsequent meeting. If adopted by City Council, amendments to the City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges, will:

1. Authorize user fees for online card payments on transactions using the Paylt digital payment system
2. Delete prescribed acceptable payment methods for City user fees and delegate authority to the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer to establish policies and guidelines regarding payment methods for fees and charges to be accepted by the City.
