

Parking Regulation Amendment – Dayton Avenue

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

The purpose of this report is to prohibit parking at all times on the east side of Dayton Avenue, between Sinclair Street and the first laneway south of The Queensway. This is in response to a petition received from affected residents on Dayton Avenue and in consultation with the Ward Councillor.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Acting Director, Traffic Management, Transportation Services recommends that:

1. Etobicoke York Community Council prohibit parking at all times on the east side of Dayton Avenue, from Sinclair Street to the first laneway south of The Queensway, running east from Dayton Avenue.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The cost of installing the "No Parking Anytime" signs on the east side of Dayton Avenue is approximately \$400.00. The funding for these signs is available in the Transportation Services Division's 2020 Operating Budget.

DECISION HISTORY

Etobicoke York Community Council, at its meeting of July 4, 2018, adopted item EY32.88 and, in so doing, rescinded the existing parking prohibition in affect at all times on the east side of Dayton Avenue, from the first laneway south of The Queensway and Sinclair Street.

COMMENTS

Transportation Services received a petition from area residents, via the local Councillor, requesting that parking be prohibited at all times on the east side of Dayton Avenue, from Sinclair Street to the first laneway south of The Queensway. This request is due to concerns that vehicles parked on both sides of the street create congestion. A map of the area is shown on Attachment 1.

Dayton Avenue is a two-lane roadway classified in the City of Toronto's Road Classification System as a "local" road. The regulatory speed limit is 50 km/h and parking is currently allowed for a maximum period of three hours (statutory, unsigned) on the east side of Dayton Avenue, from Sinclair Street to the first lane south of The Queensway. Also, parking is currently prohibited from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday, on the west side of Dayton Avenue from Sinclair Street to a point 50 metres south of The Queensway. Dayton Avenue has an urban cross-section (curb and gutter). Sidewalks are located on both sides of Dayton Avenue.

In consultation with the local Councillor, Transportation Services recommends prohibiting parking at all times on the east side of Dayton Avenue, from Sinclair Street to the first laneway south of The Queensway. This will address concerns regarding vehicles parked on both sides of the street creating congestion.
