Park People strongly supports item IE17.7, in particular Recommendation #3 for Transportation Services and Parks, Forestry and Recreation to develop a comprehensive snow clearing plan for all paved pedestrian and cycling pathways in Toronto's parks.

Public health experts are advising that getting people safely outside during COVID is vital for people's physical and mental health. This will be especially true this winter.
