### **SUMMARY**

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Presentation from Tamara Anson-Cartwright, Program Manager, Heritage Planning in recognition of Kathryn Anderson, Heritage Planner, for her thirty years of dedicated public service (1989-2020) to the City of Toronto and for her outstanding contribution as an architectural historian to the conservation of heritage in Canada.

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Kathryn Anderson joined the Toronto Historical Board in 1989 and throughout thirty years of public service she undertook research and evaluation of nearly 2,000 heritage properties and produced reports for Toronto City Council recommending their inclusion on the City's Heritage Register and for designation under the Ontario Heritage Act.

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Kathryn Anderson and her body of work has quietly made a profound impact on City Council's support for the protection of many heritage properties that contribute to the history, culture and sense of place of Toronto. She has made a substantial contribution to the heritage profession and to heritage conservation in Ontario. In recognition of her many accomplishments, Kathryn Anderson has been nominated by her peers for the Canadian Association of Heritage Professionals Lifetime Achievement Award.
