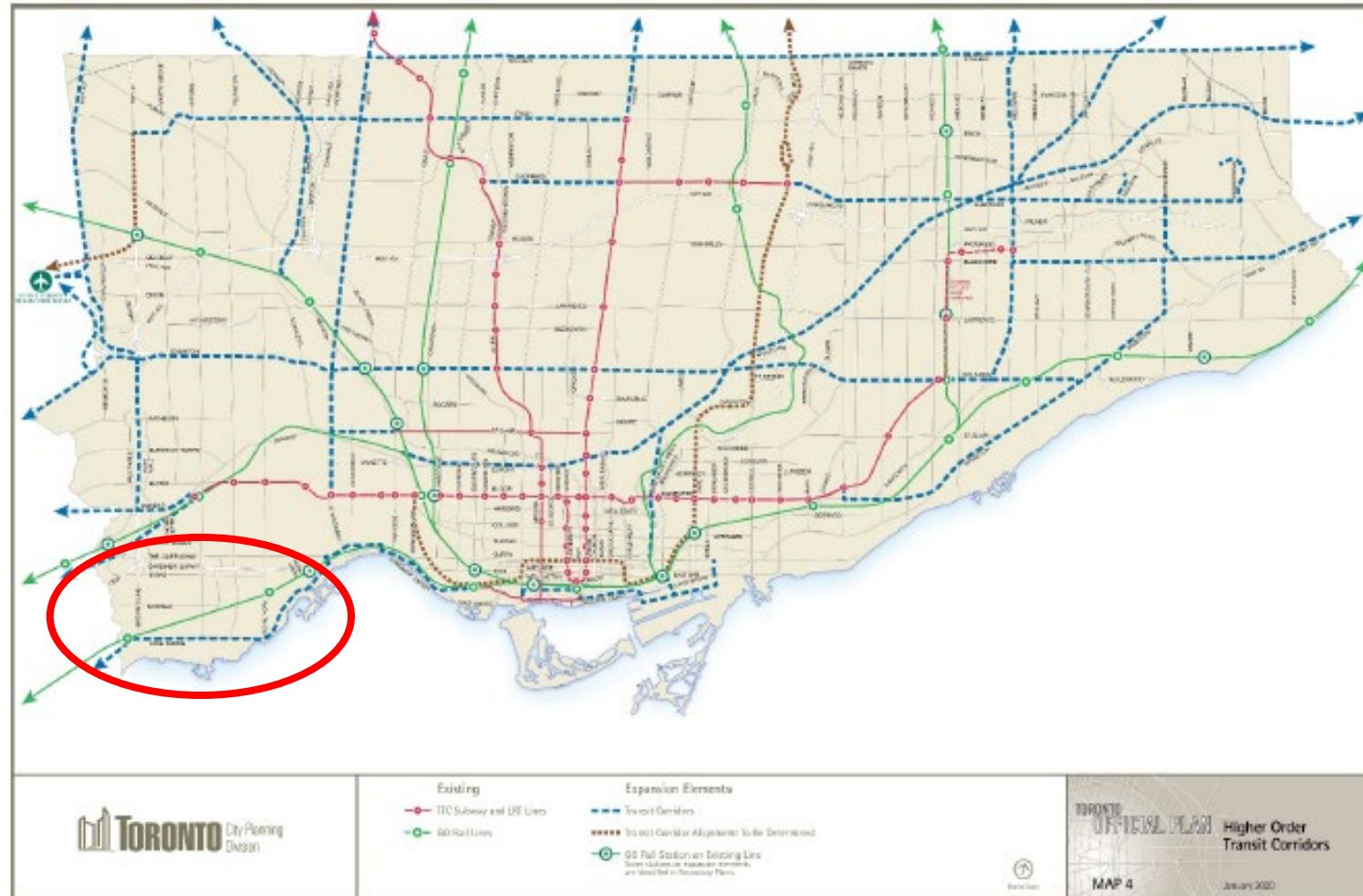

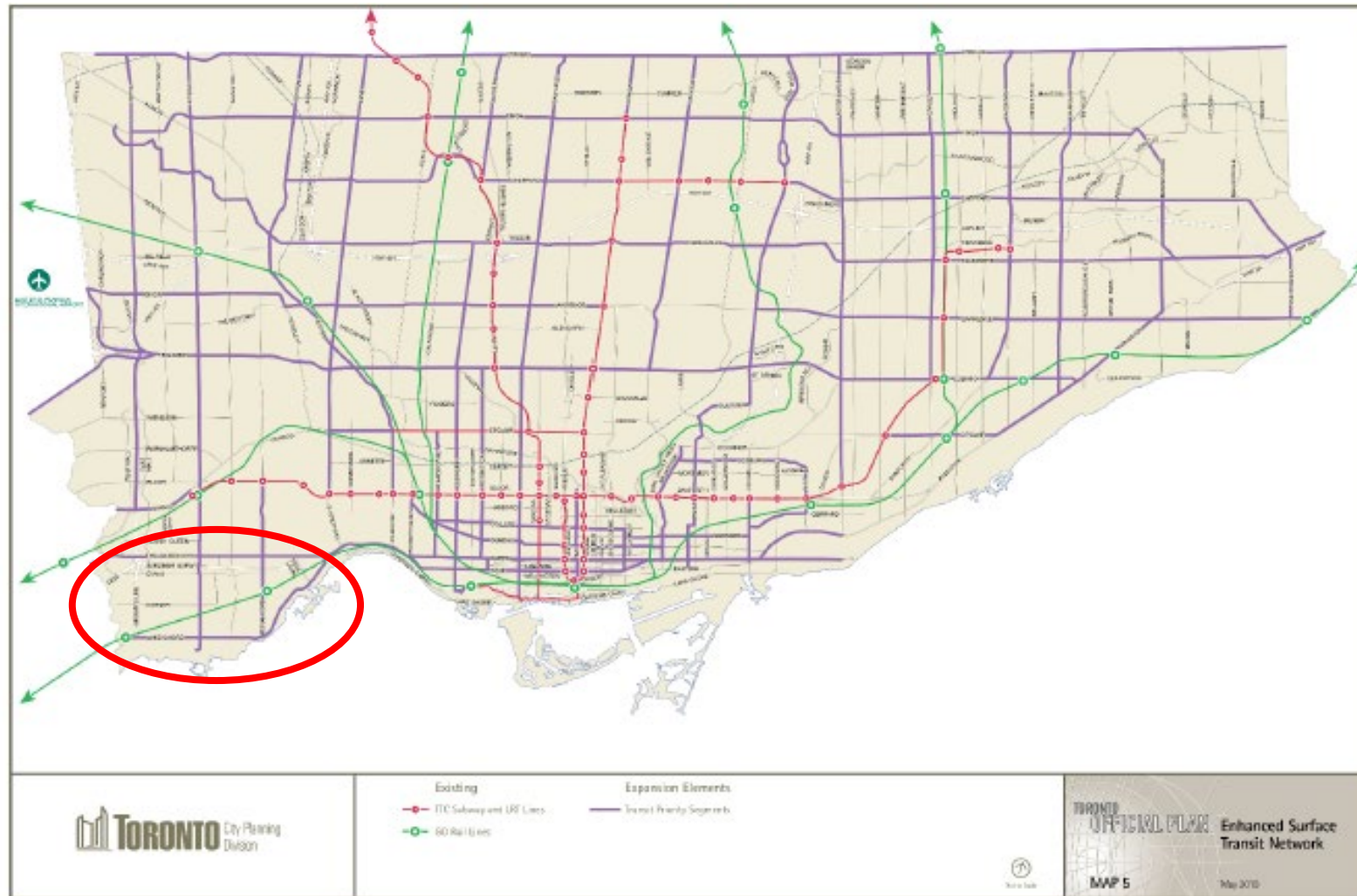
OPA 456 Proposed Map 4 HOTC



Proposed South Etobicoke LRT

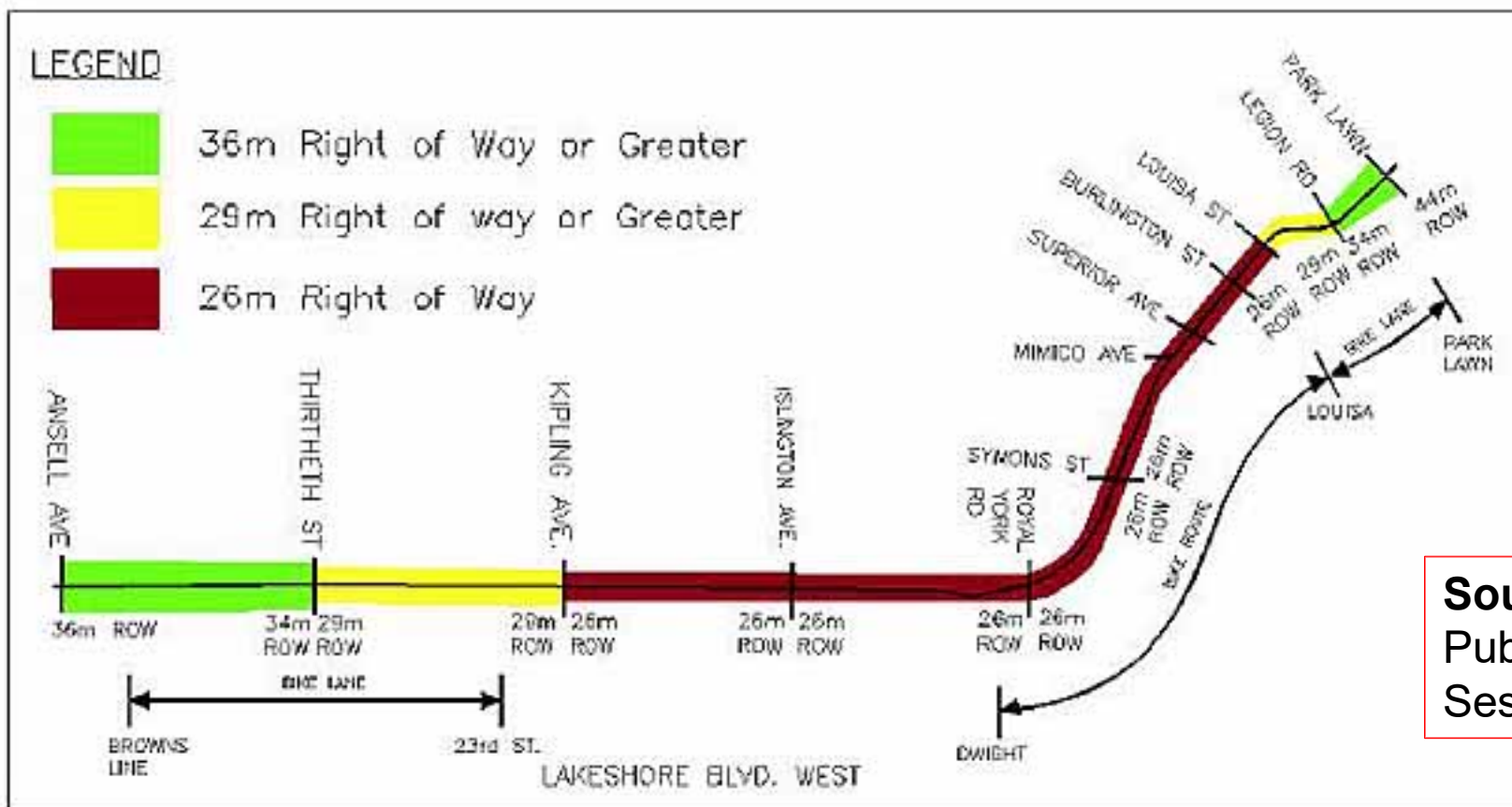


Map 5 Enhanced Surface Transit

EXISTING LAKE SHORE BOULEVARD RIGHT OF WAY

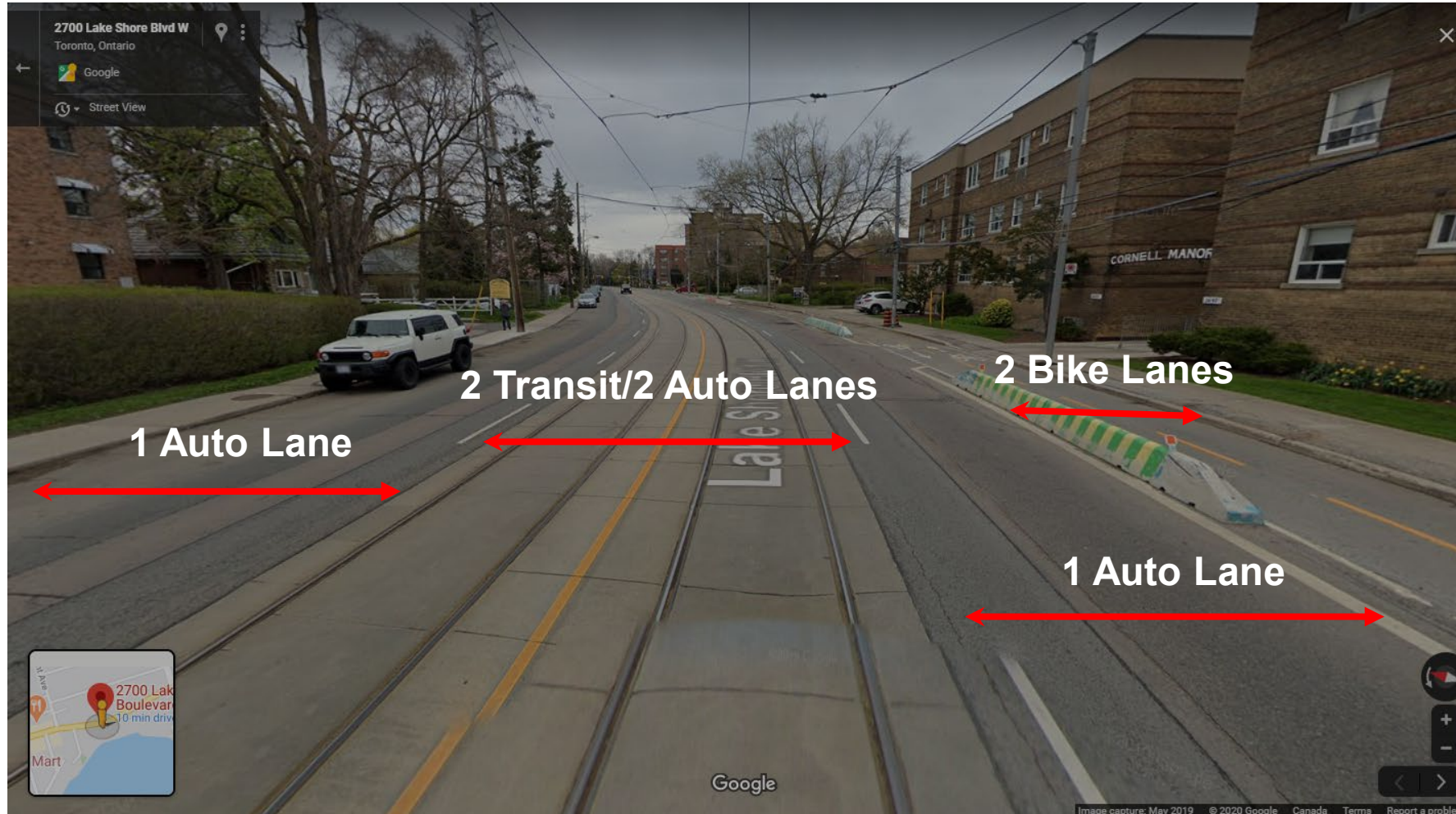

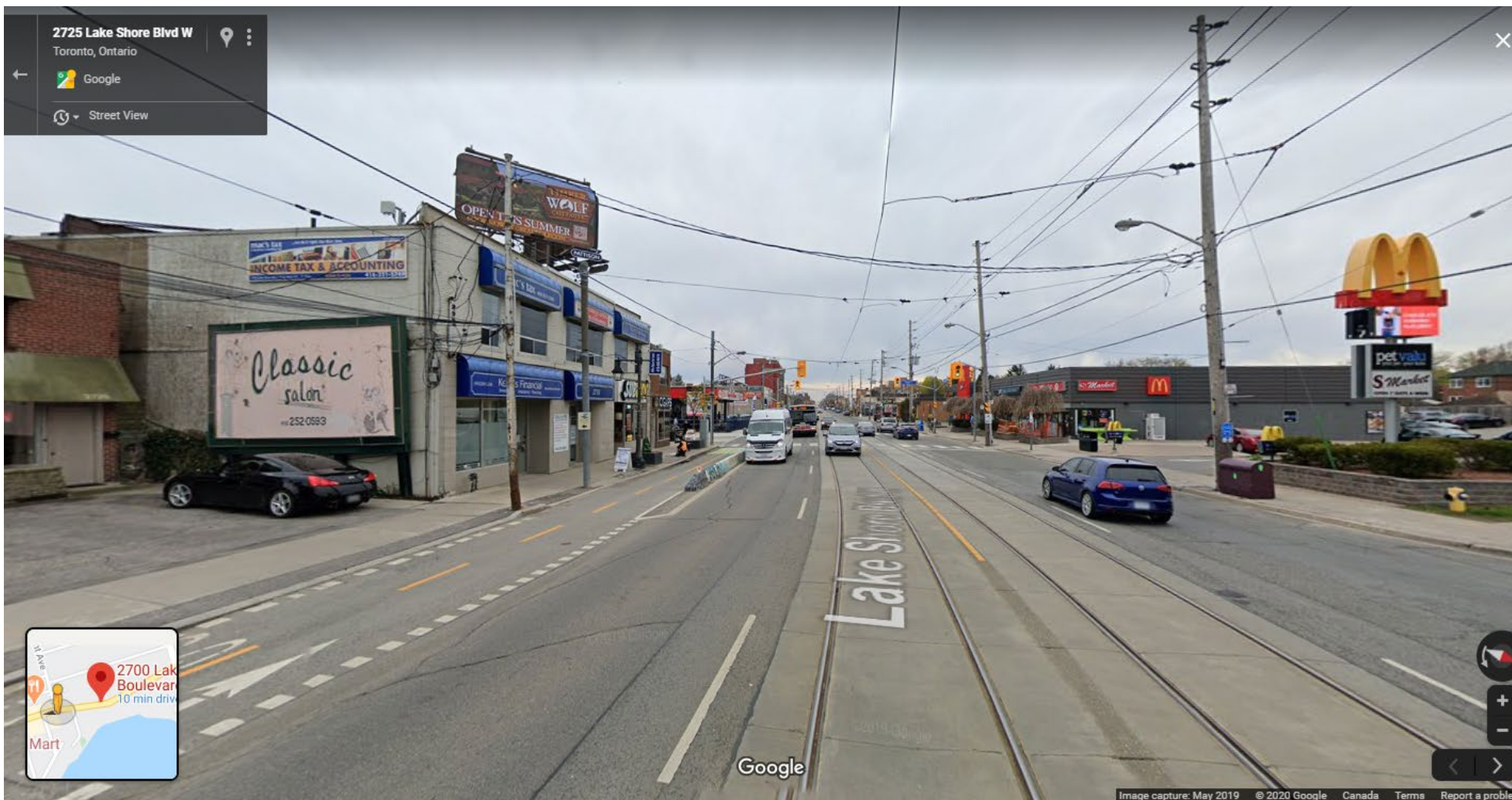
