Re: PH 19.3 – New User Fee for Employment Areas Conversion Requests

The Toronto Industry Network (TIN) is writing in support of the staff proposal to implement a fee for Employment conversion requests. While the fee is not likely to deter conversion requests, the review process and criteria outlined in the staff report will hopefully provide more rigorous testing of these conversion requests.
