The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are saddened to learn of the passing of Errol Weiser on April 17, 2020 at the age of 83.

Mr. Weiser's life was remarkable in that it included two successful careers: first in the Canadian Armed Forces where he served as a firearms instructor and competitor, and second, as a dedicated teacher in the Toronto District School Board.

A military officer who retired with the rank of Captain, Mr. Weiser represented Canada on the world stage as a competitor in the inaugural Black Powder Long Range Competition in South Africa. His love of marksmanship stayed with him for the rest of his life and he became an avid hunter, award-winning marksman and club member at Gagnon Shooting Centre & Sharon Gun Club.

Following his retirement from the military, Mr. Weiser taught for 17 years in Scarborough, 15 years at Sir Robert L. Borden Business and Technical Institute, and two years at the R. H. King Academy. As an educator, his passion was connecting with his students to help keep them off the streets and in the classroom.

Mr. Weiser was an active resident in Scarborough's Midland Park community for nearly 50 years, never missing a Midland Park Community Association BBQ and regularly participating in community cleanups and other local initiatives.
