The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are saddened to learn of the passing of Daniel Alexander (Danny) McIntyre on August 15 at the age of 87.

Danny was born and raised in Toronto. He met his future wife, Gloria when they were both in in grade school. They married in 1956 and settled in Scarborough where they raised their two children. They remained together for 64 years.

In 1954, Danny started his career in the Toronto Fire Service. He served for a period as the Chief's driver, and in 1976, was promoted to the rank of Captain. In 1980, he was appointed District Chief. He remained a firefighter until his retirement in 1992.

Well-liked and respected by his firefighter crews, Danny was instrumental in the establishment of the Firefighters Club in Markham, where he volunteered as Treasurer and Night Manager. He also contributed his electrical and mechanical skills to help expand the facility to meet increasing demand.

Off the job, he spent much of his free time helping friends and neighbors with light fixtures, outlets and appliances. He assisted the local Edgewood Public School by installing lights for the school's outdoor ice rinks. Danny also teamed up with a neighbour to encourage the municipality to plant trees on neighbourhood boulevards. In his retirement, Danny helped his son run a local propane business in Minden, Ontario, where he and Gloria also built a cottage.
