

- O \$6M NO operating fund, plus interest on LC3 assets under management
- NO Operating fund projected to last 8 years pending Network spending decisions
- O After this, local centres pay annual service fees estimated 0.5% of LC3 nominal value
- O Draw is based on actual costs as presented in annual audited statements
- O Core service costs have been established;
 supplementary costs directed by LC3 Network
- O Annual NO budget is informed by LC3 Network, approved by GMF
- O Arrangement is subject to assessment after 5 years



- Accessing more resources through national partnership development for fundraising/investment from pan-Canadian stakeholders






Rapid Prototyping Service for GTHA


