

Removal of Accessible Loading Zone - Harvie Avenue

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority to make a final decision, provided that it is not amended so that it varies with City Policy or by-laws.

Transportation Services is recommending removal of an on-street accessible loading zone on Harvie Avenue. The accessible loading zone was originally installed in 2017 based on a request from a local resident. Staff have since been made aware that the accessible loading zone is no longer required.

RECOMMENDATION

The Acting Director, Traffic Management, Transportation Services, recommends that:

1. Toronto and East York Community Council rescind the existing accessible loading zone in effect from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, on the west side of Harvie Avenue, between a point 46.1 metres south of Morrison Avenue and a point 11 metres further south.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

All costs associated with the necessary signage installation are included within the Transportation Services 2020 Interim Operating Budget estimates.

DECISION HISTORY

Etobicoke York Community Council at its meeting on February 22, 2017 adopted Item EY20.37 designating an accessible loading zone operating from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the west side of Harvie Avenue, between a point 46.1 metres south of Morrison Avenue and a point 11 metres further south. Harvie Avenue was formerly in Etobicoke York Community Council Ward 17 but with the ward boundary changes adopted by City Council in December 2018, is now under Toronto and East York Community Council Ward 9.

COMMENTS

Harvie Avenue, south of Morrison Avenue, is a 7.3-metre-wide local roadway that operates one-way southbound with a posted speed limit of 30 km/h. Permit parking is in effect from 12:01 a.m. to 7:00 a.m., daily, with alternate-side parking in effect. Heavy vehicles are prohibited at all times. There is no TTC service provided on Harvie Avenue.

Staff have been made aware that the resident who originally requested the accessible loading zone no longer requires the space for pick-up and drop-off purposes. The removal of the loading zone will result in two additional parking spaces on this section of Harvie Avenue.

Councillor Ana Bailão has been advised of the recommendation of this staff report.

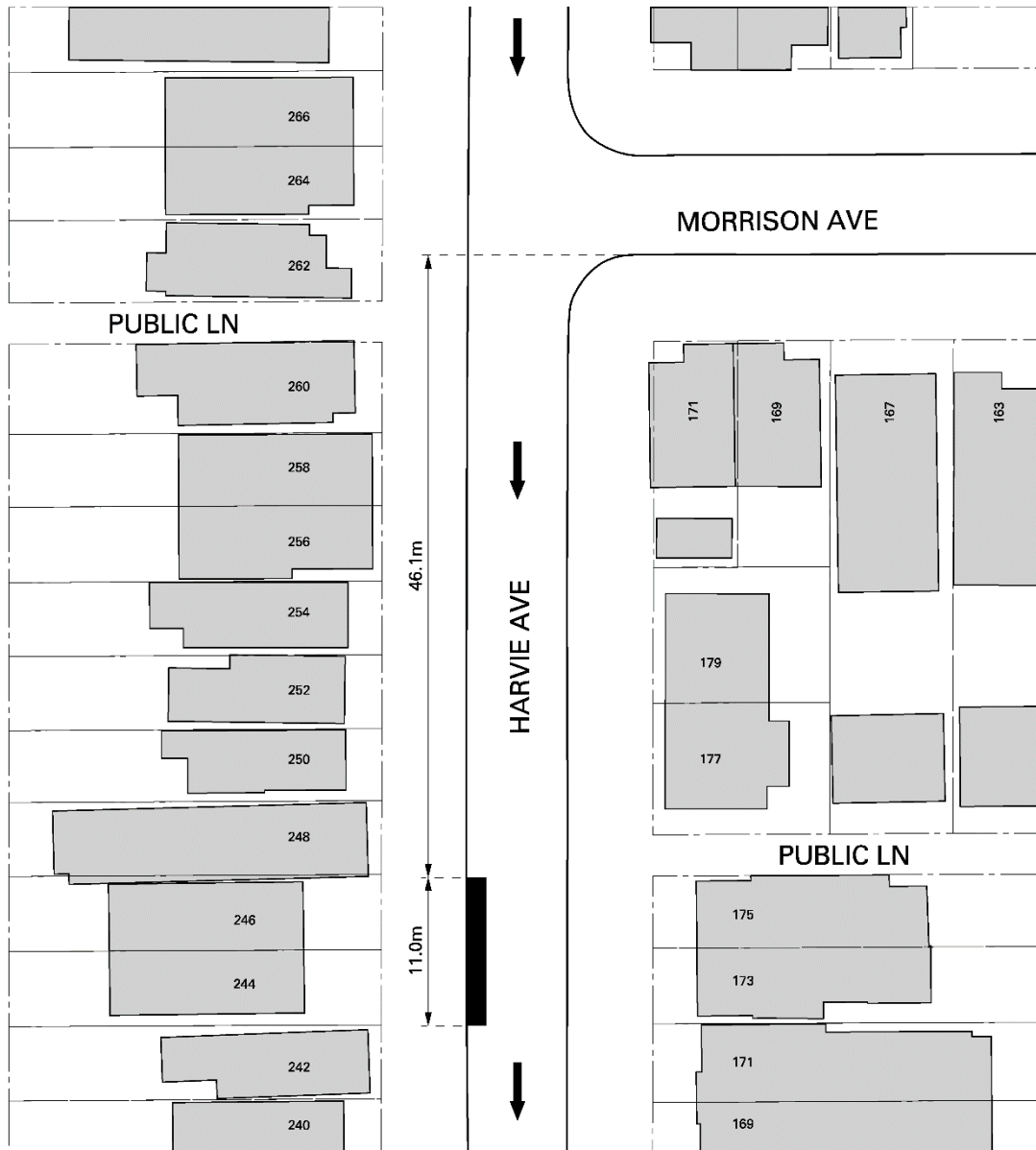
