We want to add our voices to the parents, students and teachers from the Thorncliffe Park and Flemingdon Park communities who spoke to the committee On March 23rd about the future of the Overlea Bridge. The conditions on the bridge have been unsafe for many years. There is not enough space for people who walk, dangerous conditions for those who bike, the railings and barriers are inadequate, and everyone is at risk due to excessive speeding. Something needs to be done.

Our young people must cross this bridge every day to get to school and they deserve a safe space to travel. It is the only link between our two communities, which are interconnected in many ways, and the bridge needs to be safer for everyone who must go across it. The Overlea Bridge could be an asset for our community as it spans the beautiful Don Valley but people just don't feel safe enough on the bridge to spend any time there.

We understand that a project for the Overlea Bridge has been "under consideration" since last spring. We urge you to listen to our community and take action now to make the bridge safer for everyone.
