Dear Mayor Tory and members of Toronto City Council,

**Our Toronto faith community, Trinity St. Paul's United Church\*, strongly supports the motion of Councillors McKelvie/Layton scheduled for the March 10<sup>th</sup> City Council <b>Meeting,** that the City request the Government of Ontario to develop and implement a plan to phase-out all gas-fired electricity generation as soon as possible to ensure that Toronto has a clear path to achieve our climate action goals.

Ontario's plans to increase greenhouse gas pollution from its gas-fired power plants by more than 300% by 2030 and by 500% or more by 2040 would wipe out approximately 40% of the pollution reduction benefits previously achieved by phasing out dirty coal-fired power plants.

Renewable electricity technologies can now supply us with cost-effective and emissions-free energy. These technologies, combined with water power from Quebec and deeper efficiency efforts, are much better options than firing up gas plants.

## We urge your support of this critical climate motion, joining with numerous other Ontario municipalities.
