





PortsToronto owns and operates Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport. Operations at the airport are guided by a Tripartite Agreement between PortsToronto, the City of Toronto and Transport Canada (Federal Government)

Certain components of the airport are owned by private groups. This includes the passenger terminal, which is owned and operated by Nieuport Aviation, and the parking concession which is owned by Stolport.

PortsToronto also owns and operates the Outer Harbour Marina, the marine Port of Toronto, as well as properties along Toronto's waterfront, including water lots in the Harbour.

Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport (YTZ)

- Served 2.8 million passengers in 2019 and is Canada's ninth-busiest airport.
- Service to more than 20 cities in Canada and the U.S. in 2019, with connection opportunities to more than 80 international destinations via our airlines' networks.
- Home to Porter Airlines and Air Canada, as well as regional carriers such as FlyGTA, tour operators such as HeliTours, and a flight school.
- Connect Airlines is preparing to launch service from Billy Bishop Airport in early 2022.
- More than 4,800 Medevac flights per year to/from Billy Bishop Airport operated by Air Ornge.





Airport Commercial Restart

- Porter Airlines and Air Canada temporarily suspended service in March 2020 due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- During this time the airport remained open to ensure continued operations of Ornge medevac service. In addition to patient care, Ornge headquartered its efforts to provide immunization to northern communities from Billy Bishop Airport – (Operation Remote Immunity).
- Commercial service resumed on September 8, 2021.
- From March 2020 to August 2021, the airport was quieter than usual which allowed for upgrades and improvements to the passenger and community experience.
- Billy Bishop Airport has received Airport Council International (ACI) Airport Health Accreditation.






Canada's Airports: Total Passenger Traffic Statistics








