Children's Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An employee slipped on black ice and fell, resulting in a fracture 	1
Seniors Services and Long-Term Care	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A worker, while walking down a hallway, tripped and fell and fractured her knee 	1
Shelter, Support & Housing Admin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An employee was stabbed in the back by a client after delivering the client's meal Another employee at the same location lost consciousness following the event 	2
Parks, Forestry & Recreation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A Lifeguard lost consciousness shortly after starting their shift An employee felt dizzy and briefly lost consciousness while walking with a co-worker in Kew Gardens Park after coffee break An employee, while participating in a team building exercise, tripped over another worker and fell on their arm, producing a hairline fracture 	3
Toronto Fire Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An employee lost consciousness while alone in the washroom, however, did not remember falling. At the time of the incident, there was ongoing construction at the facility. An employee was descending the stairs in a non-emergency when they missed a step and fell, landing on their knee cap. At the time they experienced some pain, but it subsided and regained full function. After still experiencing pain to the touch a month later, they learned following an examination that they had a healing fracture. 	2
Municipal Licensing and Standards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An employee was walking to their car in the parking lot, then crossed a grass median with a depression in it. Their leg got stuck in the depression and they fell forward. Days later they learned that they had fractured their left elbow. 	1
Solid Waste Management Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An employee lost control of the work truck due to a brief loss of consciousness - cause was not work-related An employee tripped and fell while attempting to remove a plastic tote out of the road sweeper's way and suffered a fracture to their left shoulder 	2

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Toronto Water	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An employee lost consciousness in a confined space • A construction crew member experienced a critical fatality and was found unresponsive, sitting inside the work vehicle at the end of in the shift - no work-related factors/causes had contributed to incident • An employee was walking backwards on a jobsite, tripped over an object, and fell, fracturing the left wrist 	3
