Requests from the September 9, 2021 Meeting

- Status of the Toronto Academic Health Science Network/TPH Opioid Task Force (new name: Toronto Overdose Action Network)
 - The status of the proposal's elements
 - Funding committed or received from other government partners; and
 - Opportunities for the Board of Health to support the proposal through the 2022 Budget process as a "New and Enhanced Commitment"



- Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) has confirmed funding of \$2,466.0 thousand to continue for the Toronto Voluntary Isolation Centre until March 31, 2022 at 100%
- Increasing 2022 budget to \$12,330.0 thousand* to cover the period of January 1 to December 31, 2022

* Approval to spend an additional \$9,864.0 thousand in 2022 will be contingent on PHAC approving the budget

Toronto Overdose Action Network Status of Proposal Elements

- Proposal submitted to Ontario Health in October 2019
- Included multiple elements needed to address the opioid crisis across the health system
 - Harm reduction teams
 - Safer opioid supply
 - Injection opioid agonist therapy (iOAT)
 - Oral opioid agonist therapy
 - Addiction consultation services



Toronto Overdose Action Network Status of Proposal Elements (con't)

- Ontario Health provided one-time funding to the Network in early 2021 of which Toronto Public Health received \$126.8 thousand to plan for the Injectable Opioid Agonist Treatment program (iOAT)
- July 2021 Provincial Announcement <u>Ontario</u> <u>Expanding Support for Addictions Treatment</u> <u>Throughout the Province</u> - \$32.7 million funding envelope



Toronto Overdose Action Network Status of Proposal Elements (con't)

- July 2021 Provincial Announcement
 - \$2.25 million received to support some elements of the Proposal:
 - expanding the Rapid Access Addiction Medicine (RAAM) clinics;
 - establishing addiction consultation services in acute care settings; and
 - coordinating and integrating services between Toronto providers to make transitioning between supports easier for clients and improving continuity of care



Other Government Funding for Opioid Poisoning Crisis

- July 2021 Provincial Announcement
 - \$6.9 million in provincial opioid response investments including:
 - adding harm reduction workers province-wide;
 - expanding RAAM clinics; and
 - establishing Acute Consultation Services in areas with high rates of opioid use
 - \$18.8 million in bed-based investments for adults and youth who need intensive supports



Other Government Funding for Opioid Poisoning Crisis (con't)

- July 2021 Provincial Announcement (con't)
 - \$4.75 million for community-based services to support lifelong stabilization and recovery, including:
 - supporting an innovative, virtual intensive treatment program at Renascent;
 - expanding appropriate supports for vulnerable and/or racialized populations; and
 - expanding peer support services



Other Government Funding for Opioid Poisoning Crisis (con't)

- Health Canada's <u>Support for Increased Access</u> to Safer Supply in Toronto - \$7.7 million funding envelope
 - Toronto Public Health received \$2.3 million over two years for iOAT
 - 2022 Budget is \$1,344.1 thousand and 4.0 positions
 - Other funded initiatives:
 - "Safer Opioid Supply Program," Parkdale Queen West Community Health Centre
 - "Downtown East Collaborative Safer Opioid Supply," South Riverdale Community Health Centre



2022 Budget Proposals

- Five proposed enhancements and one new program proposal:
 - Enhance Resources for Toronto Drug Strategy Secretariat
 - Enhance Programming for the Works
 - Expand Outreach Overdose Team
 - Expand iOAT
 - Enhance Data and Improve Data Sharing

- Funding source has not been identified
- Approval to commence and sustain the enhancements and new program in 2022 and beyond will be contingent on
 - securing funding from one or combination of the three orders of government (municipal, provincial, federal)
 - securing additional space for some of the programs

- Enhance Resources for Toronto Drug Strategy Secretariat
 - Mental health challenges, the opioid crisis and substance use have intensified during the COVID-19 pandemic
 - Budget proposal:
 - 2022: \$959.1 thousand and 10 positions
 - 2023 and beyond: \$1,863.1 thousand (annualized)



- Enhance Programming for the Works
 - Expand program to address the intensifying Opioid Crisis by enhancing harm reduction and clinical services
 - Budget proposal:
 - 2022: \$202.2 thousand and 2 positions
 - 2023: \$349.4 thousand (annualized)
 - Additional space will be needed to operationalize this enhancement



- Expand Outreach Overdose Team
 - Provide overdose response service outside of the shelter system to address spaces such as community, parks, and drop-ins
 - Enhance the availability and use of the Brave App which connects people who use drugs anonymously with community members
 - Budget proposal:
 - 2022: \$762.6 thousand and 12 positions
 - 2023: \$1,371.2 thousand (annualized)
 - Additional space will be needed to operationalize this enhancement



• iOAT Expansion

- Additional resources to expand existing program hours; increase service accessibility; and increase capacity to see more clients
- Budget proposal:
 - 2022: \$538.4 thousand and 5 positions
 - 2023: \$1,049.3 thousand (annualized)
- Additional space will be needed to operationalize this enhancement



- Enhance Data and Improve Data Sharing
 - Address data gaps on disparities for those disproportionately impacted by the opioid overdose crisis, including addressing gaps related to mental health and other substance data
 - Budget proposal:
 - 2022: \$378.4 thousand and 4 positions
 - 2023: \$634.7 thousand (annualized)



- Mobile Consumption Services
 - Address the need for supervised consumption services outside the downtown core
 - Services would be delivered via a mobile unit
 - Budget proposal:
 - 2022: \$526.3 thousand and 9 positions as well as \$300.0 thousand for capital investment
 - 2023: \$1,003.2 thousand (annualized)

Note #1 The program/service was/is reduced as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic as resources supporting the program/service were/are redeployed to support the COVID-19 response.

Note #2 The program/service was suspended as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic which led to the declaration of a provincial and municipal emergency which in turn closed the setting where this service was delivered.

- Note #3 This service has been suspended during TPH's COVID-19 Response. Inspections are being performed on a modified basis as businesses respond to public health measures which have changed how and when they operate. This service level will resume upon the end of the emergency declared by the provincial government.
- Note #4 The bed bug program complaints will be prioritized based on risk and population vulnerability.

Note #5 These inspections were impacted by a majority of the Food Safety/Environmental PHIs being assigned to the pandemic response. The length of time to conduct an inspection was increased due to the COVID-19 precautions that were in place to protect staff (e.g. physical distancing) and that the staff also conduct inspections of the premises to ensure they were complying with the Reopening Ontario Act and any relevant provincial orders and municipal bylaws.
