Summary

Toronto is home to a large and vibrant Bangladeshi community. Bangladeshi Canadians have made significant contributions to Toronto's scientific, athletic, cultural and political development, and they continue to help foster growth, prosperity and innovation throughout this great City.

The month of March is an important one for the Bangladeshi community. Every year on March 26, Bangladeshis around the world celebrate Independence Day in commemoration of their nation gaining independence from Pakistan in 1971. This day is also marked with music, parades, fairs, and various other public and private gatherings held to celebrate the history and traditions of Bangladesh. March 26, 2021 marks the 50th Anniversary of Bangladesh's declaration of independence from Pakistan.

By proclaiming the month of March as Bangladeshi Heritage Month and March 26 as Bangladeshi Independence Day, the City of Toronto honours the many significant contributions Bangladeshi Canadians have made and this landmark anniversary.
