Re: Dangers of the New Toronto Courthouse amalgamation

Dear Premier Ford and Attorney General Downey:

I am requesting an urgent meeting to discuss the dangerous plans to consolidate justice services in Scarborough, Etobicoke and North York at the New Toronto Courthouse (NTC) at 11 Centre Avenue. If this amalgamation isn't stopped, a large group of people will suffer, including

justice participants, small business owners, and court workers.

Many marginalized people involved in the justice system (including victims, witnesses and accused) live far from Toronto's downtown. Many cannot afford a day of lost wages, caregiver costs, and transit fees, so amalgamation will end up increasing justice system costs because of

delayed cases, increased arrest warrants, and thrown-out cases.

Many businesses in communities hardest hit by the pandemic – Scarborough, Etobicoke, and

North York – rely on customers from nearby community courthouses. How many will be forced

to close?
